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# Proposed Amendment to Executive Director Services Agreement

- Current Agreement for ED Services = \$134,160/year
  - Amended in FY22/23 adding \$22,000 for development of regional initiatives and participate in regional forums
  - Amendment expires June 30, 2023
- Proposed FY23/24 workplan includes continued ED participation in forums, and development and implementation of regional initiatives which requires the funding level to remain.
- Seeking Board approval to amend ED Agreement to maintain current funding level and align expiration date with original 2020 agreement terms: "until termination of this agreement by either or both parties or unless otherwise voted on and approved by the NBWA Board of Directors"
- NBWA budget will remain unchanged

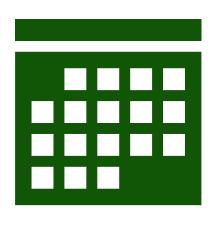

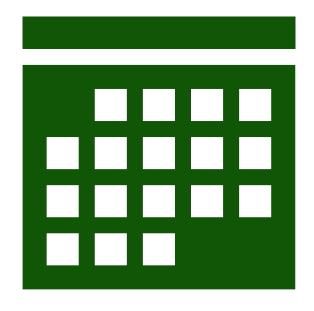

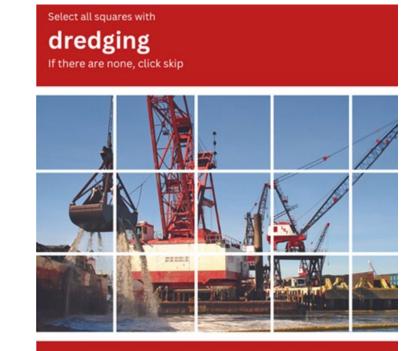
## **USACE San Francisco District Dredging Open House**
