








Small Grants and Scholarship Program Update

- Climate Resilience & Watershed Education: Projects include storytelling (KneeDeep Times), youth explorers' programs (Solano RCD, Napa RCD), and field trips (Sonoma Land Trust).
- Sustainable Landscapes & Green Infrastructure:
   Initiatives promote backyard sustainability (Sustainable Solano), bioswales (Sustainable Marin Schools), and stormwater solutions (Daily Acts Organization).
- Watershed & Habitat Conservation: Efforts focus on protecting waterways (American Canyon Foundation, River Otter Ecology Project) and integrating regional conservation strategies (Association of Bay Area Governments (San Francisco Estuary Partnership)).


